

IN THE COURT OF APPEALS OF MARYLAND  
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER ON  
RESCHEDULING APRIL ORAL ARGUMENTS  
AND POSTPONING MAY ORAL ARGUMENTS

WHEREAS, pursuant to paragraph (j) of the Administrative Order on Statewide Judiciary Restricted Operations Due to the COVID-19 Emergency filed on March 25, 2020, all matters scheduled to be heard in Maryland courts beginning on March 17, 2020 through May 1, 2020, other than certain emergency matters, have been postponed,

WHEREAS, the Court of Appeals has oral arguments scheduled for Thursday, April 30, 2020, and Friday, May 1, 2020, and Monday, May 4, 2020, it is this 27<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2020,

ORDERED, by the Court of Appeals of Maryland, that oral arguments scheduled for Thursday, April 30, 2020, Friday, May 1, 2020, and Monday, May 4, 2020 be, and they hereby are, postponed until further Notice of this Court; and it is further

ORDERED, by the Court of Appeals of Maryland, that the cases that were previously scheduled for oral arguments for Thursday, April 2, 2020 and Friday, April 3, 2020, that were previously postponed by Administrative Order filed on March 17, 2020, be, and the same are hereby rescheduled for Tuesday, May 12, 2020 and Wednesday, May 13, 2020, respectively, the dates on which the Court is currently considering holding oral argument by videoconferencing or other electronic means, and if it decides to proceed with videoconferencing, the Court will advise the parties at least 10 days in advance concerning the format and other participation procedures; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Court will entertain requests pursuant to Maryland Rule 8-523(a)(2) by parties involved in cases that have either been postponed or rescheduled by this Order to submit those appeals for consideration on brief.
