**ORDER**

Having reviewed and considered the following motions, it is this 12<sup>th</sup> day of October 2022,

1. ORDERED, that upon consideration of the “Motion to Stay the Circuit Court Proceedings Pending Resolution of the Appeal,” filed by the appellant Young Lee, the crime victim representative, and the responses thereto filed by the State and by Adnan Syed, that the appellant’s motion is DENIED; and it is further
2. ORDERED, that upon consideration of the State’s “Motion to Strike Adnan Syed’s Notice of Intention to Respond and Motion for Temporary Stay of Proceedings Pending Resolution of Motion to Strike and Motion to Stay Proceedings,” and the opposition thereto filed by Mr. Syed, that the State’s motion is DENIED.
3. Mr. Syed’s response to the State’s motion to stay includes a “Motion to Disqualify Office of the Attorney General as Counsel for the State of Maryland or Strike the State as a Party to the Appeal.” The Court will not address this motion until the Office of the Attorney General has had an opportunity to respond, but it is hereby ORDERED that Office of the Attorney General shall file its response within 15 days from the date of this Order; and

4. It is further ORDERED, on the Court's own initiative, that the appellant shall show cause in writing, within 15 days from the date of this Order, why this appeal should not be dismissed as moot in light of the *nolle prosequi* filed in the Circuit Court for Baltimore City on October 11, 2022.
