
**RESCINDING ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER FOR DESIGNATION OF JUDGES UNDER MARYLAND  
RULE 4-271 IN FREDERICK COUNTY**

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Maryland Rules 4-271(a)(2) and 16-106d3, the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals must approve the designation of other than the County Administrative Judge to suspend Maryland Rule 4-271; and


WHEREAS, On March 13, 1990, an Administrative Order was issued for designation of two or more judges hearing criminal cases in Frederick County to grant postponements in instances of appeals from the District Court or demands for jury trial; and

WHEREAS, the County Administrative Judge for Frederick County informs me that such authority has not been exercised recently and no longer is needed;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Robert M. Bell, Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals and administrative head of the Judicial Branch, pursuant to the authority conferred by Article IV, § 18 of the Maryland Constitution and Maryland Rules 4-271 and 16-101, do this 20th day of May, 2003, effective immediately, rescind the Administrative Order dated March 13, 1990.
