Irma S. Raker retired from the Court of Appeals of Maryland in 2008. Prior to her appointment to the Court of Appeals, Judge Raker served as a trial judge on the District Court of Maryland and the Circuit Court for Montgomery County. Prior to her appointment to the bench, Judge Raker served as an Assistant State's Attorney for Montgomery County, and was a Partner at Sachs, Greenebaum, and Tayler. Currently Judge Raker serves as the Chairperson of the Maryland Access to Justice Commission, and she is actively engaged in private mediation and arbitration. Since 1981, Judge Raker has chaired the Committee to Draft Pattern Jury Instructions in Maryland. Judge Raker graduated from Syracuse University and American University, Washington College of Law, and she also studied at the Hague Academy of International Law. She is an adjunct professor at the Washington College of Law of the American University, where she teaches trial advocacy. Her honors include the American Bar Association's prestigious Margaret Brent Women Lawyers of Achievement Award, the Maryland Bar Foundation's H. Vernon Eney Award, the Robert C. Heeney Award by the Maryland State Bar Criminal Law Section, a three time honoree of the Daily Record's Maryland's Top 100 Women, recipient of the Daily Record Leadership in Law Award, the Rita C. Davidson Award of the Women's Bar Association of Maryland, and the Outstanding Jurist Award of the Montgomery County Bar Association Maryland.
