Professor Rubinson is the director of clinical education for the University of Baltimore School of Law. His primary teaching and scholarly interests are in professional ethics, critical theory, and alternative dispute resolution. His articles have appeared in, among other publications, the *Clinical Law Review*, the *Arizona State Law Journal*, and the *Journal of the Legal Profession*.

Mr. Rubinson has served as reporter for the Maryland Court of Appeals Ethics 2002 Committee, which proposed changes to the Maryland Rules of Professional Conduct. He has also been chair of the Maryland State Bar Association's Section Council on Legal Education and Admissions to the Bar. He is a member of the New York and Maryland bars. And, he is co-author of the text <u>Family Mediation: Theory and Practice</u> (*Lexis/Nexis 2009 and second edition forthcoming later this year*).
