Questions/Responses No. 2 to the Request for Proposals (RFP) K19-0054-80 District Court Hagerstown Video Surveillance System

Ladies and Gentlemen:

The following questions for the above referenced RFP were received by e-mail and are answered and posted for all prospective Offerors. The statements and interpretations contained in the following responses to questions are not binding on the Maryland Judiciary unless the RFP is expressly amended. Nothing in the Maryland Judiciary's response to these questions is to be construed as agreement to or acceptance by the Maryland Judiciary of any statement or interpretation on the part of the Offeror asking the question.

1. **Question:** Can the existing camera mounting arms and housings be re-used if the new replacement camera will fit in the current housing and still provide the intended coverage?

Response: Yes

2. **Question:** If a new camera mount is installed in place of an existing mounting assembly, does the successful vendor need to repair and repaint any old holes etc. left from the prior camera mount if the new mount does not match or conceal the old holes and paint discoloration?

Response: Yes, the vendor will be responsible for repairing, repainting any old holes, etc., if the situation in question arises.

3. **Question:** Since many existing cameras are served by conduit, there will most likely be a period of time when individual cameras are taken out of service to install the new cable and camera. What is the acceptable period of downtime for the current cameras?

Response: All cameras need to be operational during courthouse hours (M-F-8am-4:30pm)

4. **Question**: Are fisheye (360 degree) or panoramic (180 degree) cameras acceptable in certain areas where coverage can be enhanced with a single camera?

Response: Yes, they are acceptable

5. **Question**: The pole in the rear parking lot where the PTZ camera is and that is being replaced by the 360 degree camera, what is the diameter of the conduit and is there any other cabling in the conduit other than the existing cable for the PTZ camera?

Response: PTZ camera in rear parking lot will be replaced by 360 degree simultaneous coverage (however many cameras it takes). We can only verify that the cables to the area ran from the existing head end to the camera outside in the rear parking lot.
