

In the Circuit Court for Somerset County, Maryland

Administrative Order

Pursuant to the provisions of Criminal Procedure Article, Sec.6-103 and Rule 4-271 of the Maryland Rules of Procedure which require that the county administrative judge or that judge's designee may grant a change of a circuit court trial date in a criminal case, it is this 13th day of June, 2015, by the Circuit Court for Somerset County, Maryland

ORDERED, that all motions for postponement in criminal cases shall be referred to the county administrative judge for ruling if the county administrative judge is present in the courthouse. If the county administrative judge is not present, all motions for postponement shall be referred to Judge Brian D. Shockley. If neither the county administrative judge nor Judge Shockley is present, motions for postponement shall be referred to District Court Judge Paula A. Price, who is cross-designated to preside in the Circuit Court for Somerset County. If neither the county administrative judge, Judge Shockley nor Judge Price is present, motions for postponement shall be referred to Judge D. William Simpson.
