ORDER

By the Court's March 25, 2021, Order, attorney Megan M. Delany (AIS No. 0306180064) was prohibited from the further practice of law in the State of Maryland for failure to comply with the obligations imposed by Rule 19-409. Attorney Delany has now requested reinstatement pursuant to Rule 19-409(c)(5)(F) and the Administrative Office of the Courts has confirmed attorney Delany's compliance with Rule 19-409.

By the Court's March 23, 2023 Order, attorney David H. Craig (AIS No. 0006010001) was prohibited from the further practice of law in the State of Maryland for failure to comply with the obligations imposed by Rules 19-409, 19-503 and 19-605. Attorney Craig has now requested reinstatement pursuant to Rules 19-409(c)(5)(F), 19-503(c)(6), and 19-606(c), and the Administrative Office of the Courts and the Trustees of the Client Protection Fund have confirmed attorney Craig's compliance with Rules 19-409, 19-503 and 19-605.

Accordingly, it is this 25th day of October 2023, by the Supreme Court of Maryland, ORDERED that attorneys

Megan M. Delany (AIS No. 0306180064) and

David H. Craig (AIS No. 000601001)

are restored to good standing by the Court and are again permitted to practice law in the State of Maryland; and it is further

ORDERED that the Clerk of this Court shall forward a copy of this Order to the Clerk of the Appellate Court of Maryland, the clerks of the circuit courts for the counties and Baltimore City, the Chief Clerk of District Court of Maryland, the Clerk of the Supreme Court of the United States, the Clerk of the United States Court of Appeals for

the Fourth Circuit, and the Clerk of the United States District Court for the District of Maryland.
