ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REGARDING STAY OF EVICTIONS DUE TO EXTREME WEATHER CONDITIONS

WHEREAS, the National Weather Service has issued a Winter Storm Warning and Hazardous Weather Outlook for Baltimore County, Maryland, effective Monday, January 6, 2025 until Tuesday, January 7, 2025;

WHEREAS, the Winter Storm Warning and Hazardous Weather Outlook indicate that additional snow is expected which could mix with freezing rain and sleet: a next-day forecasted temperature of 32 degrees Fahrenheit with wind chill values near 20 degrees is expected in Baltimore County, Maryland;

WHEREAS, the Real Property Article §8-401(f)(2)(i) of the Annotated Code of Maryland authorizes the administrative judge of any district to stay the execution of a warrant of restitution of a residential property, from day to day, in the event of extreme weather conditions, including: (1) a temperature or next-day forecasted temperature of 32 degrees Fahrenheit or lower and (2) a winter storm warning or blizzard warning issued by the National Weather Service;

WHEREAS, the Real Property Article §8-401(f)(2)(ii) of the Annotated Code of Maryland further authorizes the execution of the warrant of restitution for which the stay has been granted to be given priority and completed within 5 days after the extreme weather conditions have ceased, it is hereby

ORDERED this **7th day of January, 2025** that the execution of all warrants of restitution of residential property in Baltimore County, Maryland shall be stayed due to the extreme weather conditions, and it is further

ORDERED, that the execution of the warrant of restitution for which the stay has been granted shall be given priority and completed within 5 days after the extreme weather conditions have ceased.
