**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
REGARDING STAY OF EVICTIONS DUE TO
EXTREME WEATHER CONDITIONS**

WHEREAS, the National Weather Service indicates a hazardous weather outlook and a forecasted high temperature of 33 degrees Fahrenheit but with a real feel of 23 degrees Fahrenheit in the Baltimore County Maryland area on Friday, January 10, 2025;

WHEREAS, the hazardous weather outlook warns of a winter weather advisory later this evening with accumulating snow of 1- 2 inches along the I-95 corridor which includes the Baltimore County Maryland area;

WHEREAS, the Real Property Article §8-401(f)(2)(i) of the Annotated Code of Maryland authorizes the administrative judge of any district to stay the execution of a warrant of restitution of a residential property, from day to day, in the event of extreme weather conditions, including a temperature or next-day forecasted temperature of 32 degrees Fahrenheit or lower issued by the National Weather Service;

WHEREAS, the Real Property Article §8-401(f)(2)(ii) of the Annotated Code of Maryland further authorizes the execution of the warrant of restitution for which the stay has been granted to be given priority and completed within 5 days after the extreme weather conditions have ceased, it is hereby

ORDERED this **10th day of January, 2025** that the execution of all warrants of restitution of residential property in Baltimore County, Maryland shall be stayed due to the extreme weather conditions, and it is further

ORDERED, that the execution of the warrant of restitution for which the stay has been granted shall be given priority and completed within 5 days after the extreme weather conditions have ceased.
