## ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REGARDING STAY OF EVICTIONS DUE TO EXTREME WEATHER CONDITIONS

WHEREAS, the National Weather Service indicates a hazardous weather outlook and forecasted high temperature on Thursday, January 16, 2025 of 31 degrees Fahrenheit in the Baltimore County Maryland area;

**WHEREAS**, the hazardous weather outlook warns of a windchill of 24 degrees Fahrenheit along the I-95 corridor which includes the Baltimore County Maryland area;

WHEREAS, the Real Property Article §8-401(f)(2)(i) of the Annotated Code of Maryland authorizes the administrative judge of any district to stay the execution of a warrant of restitution of a residential property, from day to day, in the event of extreme weather conditions, including a temperature or next-day forecasted temperature of 32 degrees Fahrenheit or lower issued by the National Weather Service;

**WHEREAS**, the Real Property Article §8-401(f)(2)(ii) of the Annotated Code of Maryland further authorizes the execution of the warrant of restitution for which the stay has been granted to be given priority and completed within 5 days after the extreme weather conditions have ceased, it is hereby

**ORDERED** this **16th day of January, 2025** that the execution of all warrants of restitution of residential property in Baltimore County, Maryland shall be stayed due to the extreme weather conditions, and it is further

**ORDERED**, that the execution of the warrant of restitution for which the stay has been granted shall be given priority and completed within 5 days after the extreme weather conditions have ceased.
