ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER STAYING EVICTIONS WHEN THE HEAT INDEX IS
FORECAST TO BE ABOVE 95 DEGREES FARENHEIT.

WHEREAS, The Maryland Code of Real Property Article §8-401(d)(2)(i), the Administrative Judge of any district may stay the execution of a warrant of restitution of a residential property, from day to day, in the event of extreme weather conditions, and

WHEREAS, The Maryland Code of Real Property Article §8-401(d)(2)(ii), the execution of the warrant of restitution for which the stay has been granted shall be given priority and completed within 3 days after the extreme weather conditions cease.

IT IS, this 29th day of June, 2021 by the Ninth District Court of Maryland

ORDERED, that within District Nine, Harford County, on days when the heat index is forecast to be 95 degrees Fahrenheit and above, evictions will be suspended, and

ORDERED, that suspended warrants of restitution will be given priority and carried out 3 days after the weather returns to temperatures with a heat index below 95 degrees Fahrenheit.
