### What is Law?

Language passed by government bodies that holds force over all parties in a particular jurisdiction.



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# **Dates and Language Matter**

- Assess any materials for their timeliness to the research needed
- EXAMPLE Maryland expungement laws changed on October 1 (change to forms too)
- Maryland still uses latin phrases (Writ of mandamus)
- If a person has paperwork, ask if you can see it. Example: jury duty asking where their trial would be held
- Paperwork may also have relevant citations to laws or rules
