Maryland Public Benefits Law Quick Tips

Which Law?

Public Benefits topics are governed by state and federal law.

Most programs are founded at the federal level and managed at the state level. Often, public benefits issued are handled as an administrative matter, rather than through the courts, although judicial review may be available. Judicial review is when a Maryland Circuit Court reviews an administrative agency decision.

Best Practices

Rephrase the question

Gather details (who, what, when, where, other)

Identify the type of need (info, law text, legal assistance, govt. service forms)

Identify the broad topic & terms

Locate descriptive sources (about the law - secondary sources)

Find applicable law if needed (primary source)

Find referrals
