On May 16, 2024, Karim Abdul Rahman, appellant, filed in the Circuit Court for Harford County a notice of appeal from the court’s denial of a “Motion for Time Spent in Custody.” But, in his brief, Mr. Rahman appears to challenge not the court’s denial of the motion, but its January 2017 revocation of Mr. Rahman’s probation. Maryland Code (1974, 2020 Repl. Vol., 2024 Supp.), § 12-302(g) of the Courts & Judicial Proceedings Article, states that “[r]eview of an order of a circuit court revoking probation shall be sought by application for leave to appeal,” and Rule 8-204(b)(2)(A) states that the application “shall be filed within 30 days after entry of the judgment or order from which the appeal is sought.” Because Mr. Rahman failed to apply for leave to appeal from the revocation of his probation, his challenge to the revocation is untimely, and he does not address the judgment from which he filed the appeal, we shall dismiss the appeal.
